



This year's fundraising events were very successful raising approximately \$91,487.38. We saw Capacity Building Campaign pledges fulfilled, Smile Cookie Campaign and the Christmas Tree Raffle. Spring Fling and Ribfest were also events contributing to this year's success.



## FUNDRAISING & EVENT HIGHLIGHTS

Our first annual **Fun Run Walk n' Roll Event** was a success with over 100 participants and \$1,400 raised for the Community Living North Bay Outcomes Fund

Our 2019 **Spring Fling Fundraiser** was very successful with \$15,536.17 raised for the Community Living North Bay Outcomes Fund.

The 2019 **Ribfest** hosted by the Voyager raised \$8,436.00 for the Community Living North Bay Outcomes Fund. This event provided both a fundraising and awareness element in our community. We thank the Voyager for their support over the years.

The **Tim Hortons Smile Cookie Campaign** Raised \$53,088 in September 2019 for a total of \$137,857.00 over three years. We are thankful to the local Tim Hortons owners for their partnership with this fundraiser.

Our second annual **Christmas Tree Raffle** raised \$2,500 in December 2019! 40 local businesses and organizations generously donated gift cards for this fundraiser.

Community Living North Bay celebrated our **65th anniversary** with a big community celebration. Staff, members and families shared this important day where we celebrated the many accomplishments and progress made by our organization.

We welcomed the **L'Arche family** in 2019. Our organization grew to include the amazing individuals and staff from L'Arche.

Our **Spread the Word Inclusion** (formerly Respect Campaign) saw 2,500 signatures across our city. Individuals, organizations and community partners took the pledge to include and to show respect to everyone.

Our Respite & Family Home Program hosted their annual **Halloween Haunted House**. More than 300 families attend this event annually!

We collected over 3,790 items for **Giving Tuesday** in November 2019. We donated these items to the Boots on the Ground Team & Hope Awaits Ministries.
