POSITION OVERVIEW:

As a Transitions Coordinator (Bilingual), you will play a crucial role in assisting students and young adults with intellectual disabilities in their journey towards independence. You will work closely with families, school personnel, and community support networks to develop and implement individual transition plans that pave the way for a successful transition into adulthood.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Collaborate with students, parents, and school staff to create and implement individualized transition plans that encompass goals, strategies, and support mechanisms.
- Develop and maintain a comprehensive database of community resources, services, and agencies to ensure program participants have access to essential support networks.
- Research, design, and implement age-appropriate training curricula that align with the needs of program participants, covering areas such as mobility skills, personal care, selfadvocacy, community engagement, and safety.
- Plan and execute engaging training programs, potentially including summer programs or evening/weekend courses, either organized by the coordinator or procured from external services.
- Provide guidance to program participants and their families in navigating available funding resources such as OSAP, ODSP, SSAH, and ODSP Employment Supports.
